The way ethical dilemmas are handled within an organization is referred to as the ethical climate (Victor and Cullen, 1987) (as cited in Lemmenes, Valentine, Gwizdalski, Vincent, Liao, 2016, p. 725). Pharmacists face ethical choices constantly -- sometimes dramatic life-and-death decisions, but more often subtle, less conspicuous choices that are nonetheless important. Among the topics confronted are assisted suicide, conscientious refusal, pain management, equitable distribution of drug resources within institutions and managed care plans, confidentiality, and alternative and non-traditional therapies.
