This thesis considers the emerging role of the public prosecutor in Scotland since the 15th Century, and, more recently, the emergence of a duty of disclosure in criminal proceedings. In this regard, the historical development of the law, from the position whereby there was, on one view, no meaningful duty on the prosecutor to disclose, through to a more sophisticated and comprehensive duty to disclose evidence is examined. Finally, consideration is given to proposals for legislative reform by the Scottish Parliament, putting for the first time mutual disclosure duties and a public interest immunity framework on a statutory footing. In conclusion, the implications of this duty, for the Crown and the defence are considered, in light of earlier cases setting out the prosecutor's duties. At a time when the law is being placed on a statutory footing, possible areas of future judicial activity are considered.

Disclosure and the procedure regulating it represent a subject matter in which crime control and human rights find their synthesis. Disclosure is a complex subject that covers different branches of law as it involves aspects of a procedural nature as well as considerations that belong to the realm of human rights law. This work scrutinises and evaluates the regulation of disclosure in five criminal procedural systems in order to gain knowledge of the different ways in which the disclosure of information can be achieved.
